LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

It is my privilege to present the 2023 Annual Report for Angels Among Us. As Chairman of Angels Among Us, I would be remiss not to thank the many donors and friends who make our work possible. We would not be able to meet the critical needs of pediatric cancer families from our community without the significant support that we receive from you and the community.

The 2023 fiscal year presented many new and interesting things for our organization. The most significant being that we were able to assist 125 families with nearly \$660,000 in critical financial support as they walk a pediatric cancer journey. Families come to our organization from across Nebraska and western lowa, many of whom are struggling due to the diagnosis. Angels Among Us pays critical bills like mortgage and rent payments on behalf of these families in an effort to stave financial toxicity.

In addition, the many emotional support programs you will read abou in this report will provide you with the idea of how we are creating community among families experiencing this difficult time. Over 650 individuals took part in our emotional support programming in 2023.

Finally, we have long hoped for a permanent home for Angels Among Us and we were able to make that a reality thanks to the many special contributions made in 2023 for the new Harper Hope Center, a 3,000 square foot facility that will now house both the financial and emotional support programs.

I know that I speak for the entire board when I say that none of this would be possible without you, our donors and friends. Please know we do not take your investment lightly and appreciate the commitments you have made to Angels Among Us.

Finally, I invite you to stop by the new Harper Hope Center and see first-hand how your investments are making a real impact.



EMOTIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAMS



626.5 Volunteer Hours

This year, our emotional support programming reached a record number of pediatric cancer families. Over 600 touchpoints through 30 events throughout 2023. Events were held for every member of the family ranging from kid-centric events to outings for teens.

\$31.80 National Avg Value/hr Several opportunities for moms to connect and do fun things together were held and even a few opportunities for dads to get out and do something fun. In addition to each of these programs, we offered several family friendly events that provided opportunities for the entire family to come out and do something fun and meet other pediatric cancer families.

In early 2023, we held the first Parent's Night Out where we had 10 families drop off their kids and take the night off. Several of the parents even went to dinner together as a group, giving them an opportunity to make new friendships with families who have had similar experiences.
